#### **Grilled Cheese Sandwich**

Learn how to make a grilled cheese sandwich in a nonstick pan with buttered bread and American Cheddar for a classic hot sandwich.

Recipe by Sara Updated on November 21, 2022

Prep Time: 5 mins

Cook Time: 10 mins

Total Time: 15 mins

#### Ingredients

4 slices white bread

3 tablespoons butter, divided

2 slices Cheddar cheese

#### **Directions**

#### Step 1

Preheat a nonstick skillet over medium heat. Generously butter one side of a slice of bread. Place bread butter-side down in the hot skillet; add 1 slice of cheese. Butter a second slice of bread on one side and place butter-side up on top of cheese.

#### Step 2

Cook until lightly browned on one side; flip over and continue cooking until cheese is melted. Repeat with remaining 2 slices of bread, butter, and slice of cheese.

#### Tips

Pair this sandwich with homemade tomato soup

An easy crockpot chicken and dumplings recipe for a filling, comforting meal on a cold, snowy day. I have four children who are picky eaters, and they love this!

Prep Time: 10 mins Cook Time: 5 hrs Total Time: 5 hrs 10 mins

#### Ingredients

4 skinless, boneless chicken breast halves

2 tablespoons butter

2 (10.5 ounce) cans condensed cream of chicken soup

1 medium onion, finely diced

1 (10 ounce) package refrigerated biscuit dough

2 cups water, or as needed to cover

#### Directions

#### Step 1

Place chicken, condensed soup, onion, and butter in a slow cooker. Add enough water to cover.

#### Step

Cover and cook for 5 to 6 hours on High.

#### Step 3

About 30 minutes before serving, tear biscult dough into pieces. Place dough in the slow cooker. Cook until dough is no longer raw in the center.

#### Tips

Cover chicken with stock instead of water for a richer flavor, if you prefer

You can use more biscuit dough if you like, but the biscuits might take longer to cook.

**January 1, 1776** - During the <u>American Revolution</u>, George Washington unveiled the Grand Union Flag, the first national flag in America.

**January 1, 1863** - The Emancipation Proclamation by President Abraham Lincoln freed the slaves in the states rebelling against the Union.

**January 1, 1892** - Ellis Island in New York Harbor opened. Over 20 million new arrivals to America were processed until its closing in 1954.

**January 1, 1915** - During World War I, the British Battleship *Formidable* was hit by a torpedo in the English Channel, killing 547 crewmen.

**January 1, 1942** - Twenty six countries signed the *Declaration of the United Nations*, in Washington, D.C., reaffirming their opposition to the Axis powers and confirming that no single nation would make a separate peace.

**January 1, 1975** - During the Watergate scandal, former top aides to President Nixon including former Attorney General John Mitchell, Domestic Affairs Advisor John Ehrlichman and Chief of Staff H.R. Haldeman, were found guilty of obstruction of justice.

**January 1, 1979** - China and the U.S. established diplomatic relations, 30 years after the foundation of the People's Republic.

**January 3, 1777** - During the <u>American Revolution</u>, General George Washington defeated the British at Princeton and drove them back toward New Brunswick. Washington then established winter quarters at Morristown, New Jersey. During the long harsh winter, Washington's army shrank to about a thousand men as enlistments expired and deserters fled.

**January 3, 1959** - Alaska was admitted as the 49th U.S. state with a land mass almost one-fifth the size of the lower 48 states together.

**January 3, 1961** - President Dwight D. Eisenhower broke off diplomatic relations with Cuba two years after Communist dictator Fidel Castro had seized power and just weeks before John F. Kennedy was inaugurated as the next president.


**January 4, 1790** - President George Washington delivered the first State of the Union address.

**January 5, 1972** - President Richard Nixon signed a bill approving \$5.5 billion over six years to build and test the NASA space shuttle.

**January 6, 1941** - President Franklin Roosevelt delivered <u>his State of the Union address</u> to Congress asking for support for the lend-lease program aiding Allies fighting the Axis powers. Roosevelt also defined four essential freedoms worth defending; freedom of speech, freedom of worship, freedom from want, and freedom from fear.


